Under-five Mortality in India

- 63 Using five consecutive rounds of the National Family Health Survey data, the paper investigates the progress in the under-five mortality rate at the national and sub-national levels in India. Regional and socio-economic disparities remain a significant concern, suggesting the need for more localised policy responses to ensure equitable progress in reducing U5MR. — *Rajesh Raushan*
